In a nutshell

We have made Las Higueras Cab Franc since 2013.

It was sourced from a corner of a larger 8 hectares vineyard of 100+ year old Cab Franc. In this particular corner the cables and posts of the rows had mostly fallen down (the owners had used these bits to repair the structure in the rest of the vineyard) As we saw it, these two little hectares had returned to their natural state in nature ie old bush head vines! Old bush-head vine Cab Franc.

What you need to know

- The Vineyard & Farming**
- 100+ yrs old vines 8 hectares ttl (we produce fruit for others)
 - one particular block of old-bush head vines makes up the core
 - Alluvial soils, round stones at 40-50 cm
 - 3rd alluvial terrace of above the Achibueno River
 - 1,2 kg per plant / < 3,500 kgs per hectare
 - very small bunches
 - old style physical farming organic practices

The Vintage

The overall quality in the Maule of the 2019 vintage is *a cut above the rest*. An unusually cool spring was followed by ten days of extremely high temperature peaks late in the summer in which the accumulation of sugars was very quick, but this did not affect the quality of the crop.

Dry weather during the summer months allowed the reds in particular to be harvested at optimum maturity. Reds are slightly more alcoholic than 2018 but less than a normal year

House note

Rare bush-head vine Cabernet Franc, shows classic herbal aromas and a leafy, spicy personality with notes of graphite, cut grass (tomato leaf) backed up by fine, well integrated tannins and proper supporting acidity. Lighter in colour with surprising density and layers. Atypical new-world Cab Franc: balanced and expressive with 12,8 % alc. The difference proper farming makes.

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Critics Notes

Robert Parker – Wine Advocate



Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2018 - Lot # 112 95 Pts

The change in the wine has resulted in a 2019 Las Higueras Vineyard bottled in a lighter Burgundy shaped bottle to reflect the new profile, after they worked over five years to revive the old vines that "had been overstressed for many years. New techniques and tools like a flail mower [vs blade mower] make it possible to chip/mulch everything, including last year's cane and dung, and incorporate it all into the soil. We no longer plow this vineyard. The life in soil is more full of life/microbes and with cover crops that retain moisture better. The walk behind two-wheel tractor is the only way to get between the old narrow rows to trim cover crops. Just part of our ongoing work to redefine what 'cultivate' means and with balance on the farm grow tastier fruit..." The 2019 seems to reflect a warmer and drier year, possibly with a shorter cycle. Initially, the wine doesn't seem as balanced and refined as the 2018, especially in the texture of the tannins, but with time it blossomed and didn't stop changing in the glass; after a couple of hours, it was simply spectacular. It has similar parameters as the 2018, but ultimately there is an extra spark of acidity here. 5,500 bottles were filled in January 2020.

Descorchados – Patricio Tapa

Garage viene trabajando desde 2013 con este viñedo, un paño de ocho hectáreas de cabernet franc de más de cien años plantado junto al río Achi- bueno, un tributario del Loncomilla. Los suelos, por lo tanto, son aluviales. El vino muestra una densidad deliciosa, las frutas maduras se despliegan con generosidad en el paladar, mientras que la acidez acompaña, refrescando todo a su paso. Tiene, además, inquietantes toques orgánicos en medio de esa fruta.

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2018 - Lot # 102 94 Pts

There's a long explanation about what happened to Las Higueras, a Cabernet Franc vineyard in Maule that produced the 2018 Las Higueras Vineyard, which they consider part of the transition from a relatively tannic Chilean Cabernet Franc to something more elegant and graceful with less extraction and more tension. These transition vintages include the wines from 2017 to 2020. This 2018 has only 13% alcohol and notable freshness and is aromatic,

subtle, elegant and fresh and feels like their best effort yet. They have produced Las Higueras since 2013 from a corner of a larger eight-hectare vineyard of 120-year-old Cabernet Franc that they have returned to their natural state in nature—i.e., old bush-head vines! Old bush-head vine Cabernet Franc. They aptly (and boldly) described it as "a statesmen, with manners and dress from a bygone era, that shines amongst the younger set." 5,975 bottles were filled in January 2019. 2018 and 2019 are lots #102 and #112, respectively.

Descorchados – Patricio Tapa

Las Higueras 2019 supone un cambio importante en el estilo de este vino que Garage viene produciendo desde que encontraron, en el año 2013, este viñedo de más de cien años, plantado sobre suelos aluviales en el Maule. Comparado con sus anteriores versiones, este franc se siente mucho más fresco y frutal, con un cuerpo menos concentrado, pero con muchas más frutas refrescantes, rojas, vibrantes. Si antes era más cercano a un burdeos, ahora este franc mira más hacia el Loire. Un tinto nervioso, crocante. La fermentación se ha hecho con raspones y las extracciones han sido mucho más suaves para alcanzar este tipo de estilo.

The 2018 Cabernet Franc - Las Higueras Vineyard Lot 102 from Loncomilla, Maule, is purple in color with a rich, complex nose of blackberry, sour cherry, herbs, mint and camphor and hints of spice. An intense red with very active tannins, it is alluringly compact, conveying a chalky feel and heightened freshness that adds energy. Drink in a couple of years.

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2018 - Lot # 102 91 Pts

A fragrant nose of dried cherry, tomato leaf, rosemary, sandalwood and incense. It's medium-bodied with firm, tight-grained tannins. Fresh with a firm tannin structure and zesty, spiced character. 15 barrels produced. Drink or hold.

Descorchados – Patricio Tapa

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2017 - Lot # 92 95 Pts

Las Higueras is a vineyard on the northern bank of the Achibueno River in the Maule Valley and was planted to cabernet franc in 1940 as well as to other varieties such as malbec and cariñena. Garage selected the cabernet franc and malbec plants (a minimal percentage) for this wine, co-fermented the grapes, and aged the wine in used oak barrels for two winters. The result was a production of a bit more than 5,000 bottles (5,264) of a wine that has a strong tannic presence and firm, sharp tannins accompanied by equally sharp acidity. A wine full of red fruits, herbs, and spices. A wine that's irresistible today, but with tremendous aging potential as well.





Robert Parker's Wine Advocate # 247

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2017 - Lot # 92 94 Pts

The 2017 Las Higueras Vineyard is a Cabernet Franc from Maule and, therefore, is quite different in style from the one from Pirque in Maipo, with less herbal and mint notes and more of a fruit-forward, peachy personality, perhaps aided by the warmer year. In any case, they changed the farming of this vineyard as they took over, starting with the pruning and training of the vines, making them look more like the bush vines and letting them grow above the first wire, which lent more shade to the fruit and seemed to result in a slower maturation of the grapes and less alcohol (this is only 12.9%!). They also sold some fruit from this vineyard to other wineries, so in the future, we might get to taste different interpretations of this very same vineyard. They also started working with cover crops and removed the synthetic fertilizers and other stuff, even abandoning irrigation and going back to cultivating it the old way with the aid of vigneronos from Sauzal and Puico. They say they really noticed a big difference now that have been working it for three years. The plants are now 116 years old. With time in the glass the wine develops a very specific note of merken, a Chilean paprika-like blend of spices. 5,264 bottles were filled in January 2019.

Robert Parker's Wine Advocate # 239

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2016 - Lot # 82 93 Pts

The 2016 Las Higueras Vineyard bottling (Lot #82) is from a place close to Linares that they now manage entirely (and sell some fruit to others) and has some herbal aromas and a leafy, spicy personality. It has very fine tannins and good freshness. It's elegant, with some complexity. Some 4,000 bottles produced from 13 barrels. It was bottled in December 2017.

Robert Parker's Wine Advocate # 239

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2015 - Lot # 72 92 Pts

As with many of their bottlings, I was able to compare the 2015 Las Higueras Vineyard with the 2016, and this was darker, more concentrated and powerful. It feels quite ripe and not that varietal. The palate is medium to full-bodied, with abundant, slightly dusty tannins. 3,764 bottles were filled in December 2016.

Robert Parker's Wine Advocate # 230

Las Higueras Vineyard - Maule Valley Cabernet Franc 2014 - Lot # 62 93+ Pts

I also got to taste the 2014 Las Higueras Vineyard bottling (marked lot #62). This vineyard in the Caliboro zone of Maule has provided a very balanced and expressive Cabernet Franc, with complexity and nuances, fine tannins and good freshness. 3,642 bottles produced. It was bottled in December 2015, having spent two winters in barrel.

Anecdotal narrative

Story about Las Higueras:

We have made Las Higueras Cab Franc since 2013. It was sourced from a corner of a larger 8 hectares vineyard of 100+ year old Cab Franc. In this particular corner the cables and posts of the rows had mostly fallen down (the owners had used these bits to repair the structure in the rest of the vineyard) As we saw it, these two little hectares had returned to their natural state in nature ie old bush head vines! Old bush-head vine Cab Franc.

Five years ago, we entered into an agreement to rent the whole 8 hectares in a long-term deal. We have brought in our dry-farming vignerons from Sauzal and Puico to help and have begun cultivating the vineyard the old way. The vineyard has responded well to what was a formidable pruning to recover and rebuild the old vines, but already we are seeing a re-birth.

The 2018 – 2021 vintages have been harvested at 12,8-12,9 alc.

We are looking forward to future years now we manage the whole vineyard!
